

Call for Nominations
113th Interagency Institute for Federal Health Care Executives
Deadline Date: 24 January 2008

The 113th Interagency Institute for Federal Health Care Executives will be conducted during 31 March – 11 April 2008, at the Hyatt Arlington, Arlington, Virginia.

The Office of the Surgeon General (OSG) requests Agencies to submit the names and CVs of O-5/O-6 officers they would like considered for this training to LCDR Gregg Davis (Gregory.Davis@hhs.gov) by **24 January 2008**. Individual officers interested in being considered for this training must submit their request through their Agencies. OSG will then choose the officers to attend.

Agencies are responsible for all expenses associated with this training (tuition is \$1,790.91 and is payable to the U.S. Treasury Department). Description:

The purpose of the Institute is to provide an opportunity for the seasoned, practicing Federal health care executive to examine some of the current issues in health care policy and management and to explore their potential impact on the Federal health care system, within a 2-week course. The design of the course assumes a high level of conceptual knowledge and operating ability on the part of the participants.

Given the intelligence and sophistication of these selected executives, the faculty maximizes the learning experience by presenting new materials resulting from research and experience, as well as examples and case studies from the contemporary national health policy decision-making process. Faculty members also seek involvement and interaction by the participants to stimulate understanding and communication across traditional agency boundaries.

This activity has been planned and implemented in accordance with the Essential Areas and Policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint sponsorship of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) and the Interagency Institute for Federal Health Care Executives.
