Personnel INSTRUCTION 2--Declaration of the PHS Commissioned Corps
to be a Military Service

Section A. Purpose and Scope

This INSTRUCTION lists the authorities and the officials who may exercise these authorities relating to the issuance of a declaration to make the PHS Commissioned Corps a military service.

Section B. Delegation of Authorities

30.201	Declare the commissioned corps a military service and a branch of the land and naval forces of the United States in time of war or national emergency under authority of Section 216 of the PHS Act (42 U.S.C. 217).		P
30.202	Utilize the Public Health Service in time of war or national emergency to such extent and in such manner as will promote the public interest under authority of Section 216 of the PHS Act (42 U.S.C. 217).		P
30.203	Direct, in time of war or national emergency, the extent to which the commissioned corps shall operate as other than a part of the Public Health Service under authority of Section 216 of the PHS Act (42 U.S.C. 217).		P

30.204	Determine, in time of war or national emergency, the extent to which the commissioned corps shall be subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice under authority of Section 216 of the PHS Act (42 U.S.C. 217).		P
30.205	Exercise the authority vested by law in the Department of the Army, the Secretary of the Army, or other officers of the Department of the Army with respect to military rights, privileges, and benefits granted to PHS commissioned officers under authority of Sections 212(a) and (c) of the PHS Act (42 U.S.C. 213(a) and (c)).	7/31/78	Dir, CPOD/ OPM/OM
