Chief Professional Officer Message

Public Health Service Environmental Health officers have played a critical role in the development and leadership in the field environmental health and continue to do so.

The American Academy of Sanitarians (AAS) began in November 1956, when the Sanitarians Joint Council (SJC) met at the American Public Health Association (APHA) Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The professionals who made up the SJC were representatives from three associations whose membership represented the majority of sanitarians in the country: the APHA, the International Association of Milk, Food and Environmental Sanitarians (IAMFES) now the International Association for Food Protection (IAFP), and the National Association of Sanitarians (NAS) now the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA).

The twelve founding members of AAS included CAPT Darrold Taylor, Director of the USPHS Milk and Food Branch. In 1963 CAPT Taylor was appointed as the first "Liaison Officer for the Sanitarian Category," in essence our first CPO. Today our category continues to be represented on the AAS Board of Directors:

We also have EHOs serving in leadership positions with NEHA and the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA). CDR Anna Khan serves as NEHA's First Vice-President and CDR James Speckhart is the Region 8 Vice-President (DE, MD, PA, VA, DC, WV, and all NEHA members of the U.S. armed forces residing outside of the U.S.). Furthermore, CAPT Bradley King serves as Secretary on the AIHA Board of Directors and was recently elected as AIHA's Vice President for the 2023–2024 term. Following his year as Vice President, CAPT King will progress through year-long terms as President-elect, President, and Past President of AIHA.

CDR Aaron Niman, MPH, REHS/RS, CPH Environmental Protection Agency, Washington, DC

Leadership Perspective

I currently serve as an Environmental Health Scientist with EPA's Office of Pesticide Programs and a national advisor on the evaluation of epidemiologic research and development of dietary exposure methods. Overall, I have more than 15 years of experience in public health, risk assessment, and program management. My passion is using data science and evidence-based review methods to strengthen the scientific foundation of environmental health and promote transparency in public policy.

I have also been appointed by EPA to lead an international delegation to the United Nations Food Standards Programme which promotes harmonization of international food safety standards on pesticides.

While much of my USPHS career has focused on environmental health, have broad public health interests, having served in FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research as a Program Manager for the Sentinel Initiative. I adopted a coaching leadership style that builds off my lifelong participation in athletics. This approach focuses on strengthening teams by promoting professional growth while providing guidance on goals, tactical objectives, and challenges. My use of coaching leadership also recognizes that public health professionals are increasingly called upon to work on dynamic, multidisciplinary teams and have diverse strengths, weaknesses, and motivations. As such, it is critical to build an organizational culture that values continuous learning and empowers EHOs to take risks and re-invent themselves as our public health mission evolves.

- Served on two deployments during Operation Allies Welcome mission to support our Afghan allies seeking resettlement in the U.S.
- U.S. Delegation to the Codex Committee on Pesticide Residues (CCPR). My work on the CCPR culminated in an annual international committee meeting in China where I was given the opportunity to engage with the global community to protect consumer health, promote global trade, and strengthen food security.
- Instrumental in National Launch of FDA's Sentinel Initiative, 5/2008.
- Advisor to World Health Organization on its Risk Assessment of Indoor Residual Spraying of DDT to Control Malaria.
 - I performed an independent data analysis that was included in World Health Organization's final report,
 "Environmental Health Criteria 241 DDT in Indoor Residual Spraying: Human Health Aspects."

CDC's Environmental Public Health Tracking Program

The Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) Environmental Public Health Tracking Program is a nationwide network of integrated health an environmental data that can be used to drive public health interventions and actions to improve health. Over the past 20 years this system has collected, integrated, and analyzed non-infectious disease and environmental data from nationwide partners.

The Tracking Network has data and information on the environment, exposures, health effects and population characteristics. CDC's site allows you to view dynamic maps, charts, and graphs on many different health topics. Also check out State and Local Tracking Programs for even more topics, such as harmful algal blooms, radon, and food safety information.

The CDC currently funds 26 state and local tracking programs. These grantees work tirelessly saving lives and protecting communities from health threats. Learn more about success stores at think <u>link</u>.
