



What is Engineer Strategic Plan (ESP)?

- Framework to execute the vision and mission of USPHS as related to Engineer officers
- Provides targeted direction to advance our engineer category
- Serves as a common operating plan for engineer officers



4 Focus Areas

- 1. Recruitment and Retention
- 2. Career Development
- 3. Readiness and Deployment Support
- 4. Modernization



Focus Area 1: Recruitment and Retention

➤ Increase the force strength of Engineer officers to meet mission requirements. Identify and make recommendations regarding factors that affect the recruitment and retention of Engineer officers.

- Align efforts to support recruitment, hiring, and retention of officers.
- Engage in outreach efforts with third parties.
- Evaluate onboarding processing of active duty-cleared engineer applicants.
- Implement and inform candidates of CCHQ's policies.
- Work with CCHQ to identify factors that may lead to disqualification and/or applicant withdrawals and provide recommendations for engineer appointment standards.
- Develop After Action report to track efforts and outcomes of recruitment and outreach strategy.



Focus Area 2: Career Development

Provide resources and guidance for the professional development and career progression of Engineer officers within Career Pathways and tracks.

- Develop recommendations for Engineer career progression paths.
- Work with CCHQ to better align billets with leadership roles.
- Establish collaborative opportunities between the Applied Public Health Engineer disciplines
 to support engineer officers' ability to meet promotion benchmarks and cross-discipline
 networking.
- Identify and share relevant engineer credentials, licensures, and advanced degrees.
- Identify and recognize officer contributions and achievements.
- Increase EPAC mentor-mentee assignments.
- Develop resources for work-life balance and integration with USPHS mission challenges.



Focus Area 3: Readiness and Deployment

➤ Ensure the ability of Engineer officers to maintain readiness and to effectively respond to deployment needs.

- Provide recommendations for expanded deployment roles for Engineer officers.
- Establish and maintain database of officer skillsets.
- Connect and support officers deployed in the field.
- Identify and recommend relevant disaster response engineer trainings.
- Highlight versatility of engineer deployment roles.



Focus Area 4: Modernization

➤ To maintain Engineer category visibility and relevance to the Corps and advocate for Engineer category interests during CCHQ modernization process and transition to the Applied Public Health promotion category.

- Identify opportunities to promote Engineer category visibility and engagement within the Applied Public Health promotion category and to CCHQ.
- Establish resources and guidance to implement modernization promotions and separations/retirement policies.



How will the ESP be implemented?

- Primary vehicle will be through EPAC
 - Subcommittees
 - Ad hoc workgroups
 - Special projects
- Measurable outcomes may be captured in the endof-year reports



12/06/2022 – EPAC Innovation Form received

- Problem: Lack of self-nominations for EPAC Chair-elect
- Proposed Solution: Allow new incoming Voting Members to run
- Alternate Solution: Remove barrier for former Voting Members



Rules Vice Chair LCDR Melissa de Vera



- 1. Remove from Article I.III Section 1 barrier for former EPAC Voting Members to have been selected for a second or third term as a requirement to run for EPAC Chair-elect.
- 2. Add to Article I.I Section 7 a special 2-year term for former Members appointed to Chairelect AND add to Article I.III Section 1 that special term is automatic if elected.
- 3. Add to Article I.I Section 2 that two Voting Membership seats will be reserved for the special 2-year terms to ensure that Membership does not exceed maximum allowed by Charter.
- 4. If above changes pass, add to Article I.III Section 1 the requirement of a former EPAC Voting Member to have received an SAA with in the last 6 years for a previously served term as an eligibility requirement for running for EPAC Chair-elect.



Impacts

- Larger pool of potential Chair-elect candidates
- Maintains the Bylaws 1-year rule without placing further restrictions on former VMs
- Keeps Chair-elect nomination process and the Voting Member selection board separate and independent processes
- Allows former VMs more flexibility for planning their service with EPAC



Concern: Chair must be Member

- Not explicitly instructed by the Charter
- Bylaws do require that the Chair is an EPAC Member
 - Additionally, if the Membership term expires at end of term as Chair-elect, then term of Membership may be extended with <u>SG approval</u>.
- Bylaws imply that Chair-elect should be a member but do not explicitly state



Solution: Chair must be Member

- Allow incoming Chair-elect to serve a special 2-year term
 - Ensures Voting Membership during term as Chair
 - Does not require SG approval, Charter allows PACs to designate 2-year terms
 - Gives former Members flexibility in planning their EPAC careers
 - Can run multiple times without committing to Membership term if run for Chair-elect is unsuccessful
 - Those who serve get immediate respite by not having to fulfill obligations as a Member after completion of their Chair term



Concern: Vetting Former Members

Solution: Must have received an SAA

- SAA only awarded to Members who successfully serve a 3-year term
- Recently awarded to ensure recent participation in EPAC
