


- Application Process: https://www.pmi.org/certifications/process
 - **Fulfill Eligibility Criteria** (4-yr degree; 4,500 hrs. leading/directing projects; 35 hrs. PM education)
 - **Complete Application** (education and PM experience)
 - **Application Review** (PMI verifies or audits)
 - **Payment** (\$405 member; \$555 non-member)
 - Schedule Test Appointment (through online system at in-person test site)




My Path to PMP (con't)

Exam Prep

- Study, Study, Study!!!
 - 200 multiple-choice questions (taken within 4 hours)
 - Purchase and thoroughly review PMBOK
 - https://www.pmi.org/pmbok-guide-standards/foundational/pmbok
 - Take as many practice exams/questions as you can (TIME YOURSELF!)
 - Search for and use PMP Exam Prep apps
 - Boot Camp is HIGHLY recommended


Benefits to Career and PHS

Project Management Professional (PMP)

- Provides Framework / "Way of Thinking" in Managing Projects
 - Scope, Time, Cost, Quality, Human Resources, Communications, Risk, Procurements, Stakeholders
 - Managing and leading multiple teams, departments, offices, projects with interdependencies, and how they affect each other
- Applicable to Deployment situations
 - They are often very FLUID projects, often on a large scale
- Develops Leadership and Strategic Thinking
 - Extremely valuable for Commissioned Officers
 - Helps you see the "big picture" and think about the strategic value you offer in the work you perform on a daily basis
 - Know when and how to step back, and get into the "weeds" when needed



Implementation Lead

- Fund 28 local education agencies to improve the sexual health and wellness of adolescents:
 - Provide medically accurate and scientifically proven STD, HIV, and teen pregnancy prevention education in schools;
 - Link youth to sexual health services onsite or to community based organizations or health departments;
 - Ensure safe and supportive environments for all youth
- Supervise 4 GS-13 civilian staff who serve as Project Officers
- Support and mentor staff
- Develop partnerships and opportunities to leverage programmatic work
