It has truly been an honor to serve as your 2022 DHPAG Chair. Thank you for your tireless work this year. Together, we have made significant progress confronting the pandemic and weathering the changes that have come about in the Corps—all while standing strong by serving our agencies and advancing and promoting the oral health and public health of our nation. While challenges remain, the progress we have made would not have been

possible without your support. Your capabilities and dedication are what make the Commissioned Corps strong and ensure that we continue to advance and protect the health of our nation.

As we look to the year ahead, we must build on the innovations that we put to work within our PAG, making our Corps more efficient, more resilient, and effective. Our PAG has made **HUGE** strides this year within **every** subgroup, and I could not be more proud of everyone's hard work. Our **Awards** team promoted DHPAG awards across multiple listervs and created Q&A sessions alongside listening sessions for officers, so that they could better understand how to prepare and submit a competitive DHPAG Award application package. Because of these improvements, we had a record number of applications to review this year! Our **Stakeholder & Community Engagement** team collaborated with the DePAC category and our very own **Recruitment & Retention** team to develop a dental and dental hygiene clinical vacancy list—creating visibility of new job openings for dental hygiene officers! JOSEPH GARCIA JR. AWARD



LCDR Keasha Myrick is the recipient of the HSPAC 2022 Joseph Garcia Jr. Award. This award is presented to an “outstanding junior health services professional” in honor of advancing the public health for the nation. LCDR Myrick is a registered dental hygienist with Indian Health Service (IHS) serving as Operations Director to the Dental Support Center-Oklahoma City and Bemidji Areas and supports the Dental Support Center in Great Plains Area. She manages two dental programs of 83 dental clinics and supports a third dental program of 19 dental facilities. She manages national oral health initiatives and surveillances; provides funding to support dental initiatives to awarded dental clinics; organize five yearly continuing dental education seminars and conferences for approximately 1120 dental staff; and works closely with eight other Dental Support Centers.

LCDR Myrick commissioned into USPHS in September 2017 with a bachelor’s in Dental Hygiene and a doctorate in Health Science. Prior to commissioning, she provided dental services to an underserved population in Georgia, her native state, for over 12 years. She later joined IHS in December 2015.

LCDR Myrick, not only serves within dental communities but numerous committees within IHS and PHS: IHS-COVID19 Vaccine Teams (4), National Oral Updates Conferences, and assist with special projects on national and local IHS and dental levels and PHS-HSPAC Readiness Subcommittee as ARP Liaison for DHPAG, HSPAC Recruitment & Retention as Executive Secretary, Team Lead of Candidate Application Tracking Team and named 2020 Top Performer, HSPAC Career Development as DHPAG Liaison, DHPAG Technical Readiness Chair, DHPAG Communication co-Chair, DHPAG Training, Education, and Mentorship Dental Hygiene Directory Update co-Chair, JOAG Readiness & Development Officer Readiness Team Lead and APFT co-Team Lead, JOAG Professional Development Career Development co-Team Lead and named 2021 Outstanding Committee Member, and COA local branch, Oklahoma City Chapter. LCDR Myrick was awarded 2021 DHPAG Junior of the Year, 2018 IHS National Oral Health, Junior Dental Hygienist of the Year and 2022 National Oral Health, Senior Dental Hygienist of the Year.

LCDR Myrick takes great pride as a mentor and mentee in advancing public health priorities, personally and professionally

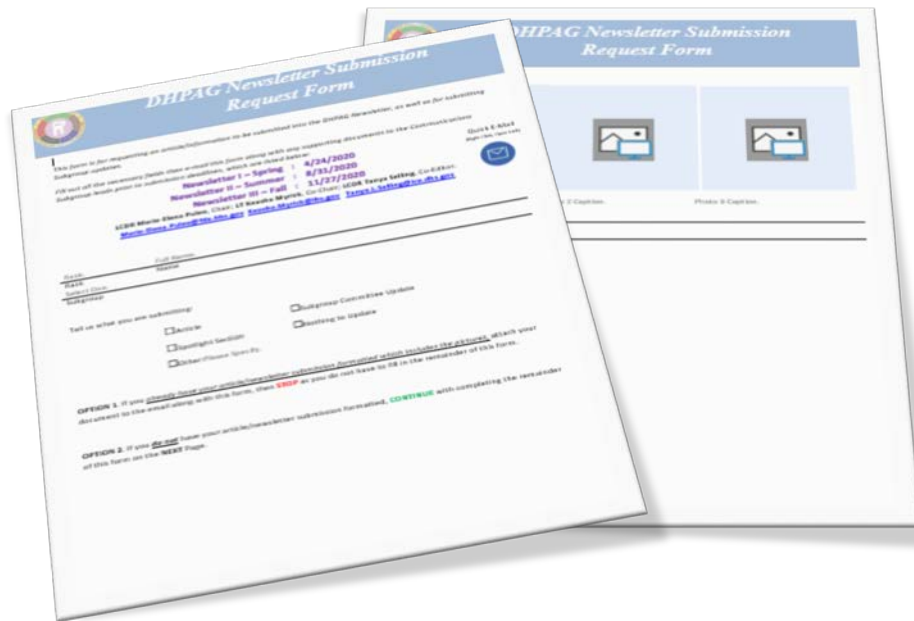
