These contributions, whether they have been in leadership, clinical achievement, or mentorship must have had a lasting impact on federal health care and demonstrated a lifetime commitment to advancing health care quality and efficacy. Their lifelong careers in development, invention and innovation in the health care field have had a significant impact on society. These individuals have the potential to be role models and are inspirational to others. The award is open to any person who through his or her life's endeavors has demonstrated a significant and lasting contribution towards better health outcomes in federal medicine. The award is targeted towards demonstrated value delivered in health outcomes, rather than purely academic achievement. Therefore, nominees will be expected to have demonstrated tangible and persistent contributions that led toward improved health outcomes in an identifiable group of individuals. The recipient of this award must have had a significant career span. Contributions should be recognized at local, national and international levels.
