### Lester Caplan Award Nomination Page

Derek M Allmer, O.D., has worked in a wide variety of positions throughout his 25 year career. He brings experiences from retail optometry, private solo and group optometry practices, hospital-based optometry, and a group ophthalmology practice to the Indian Health Services.

Following a partial tribal assumption of the Rapid City Service Unit in July of 2019, Dr. Allmer was assigned as the Director of Optometry for the new Oyáte Health Center in Rapid City, SD. Since that time, Dr. Allmer has put in the extraordinary effort needed to get the Oyáte Eye Clinic established and fully equipped. Working as the sole eye care provider at the time, he used his clinical skills to produce a high patient satisfaction rate, working full-time as a provider and putting in the extra hours needed to complete the administrative side of his job. All of his over and above efforts have produced a technologically advanced clinic that allows for improved care of their patients. Since inception, the eye clinic has now grown to a more appropriate three optometrists following a recent full tribal assumption of the remaining Rapid City service unit. Waiting times have been reduced from three months to less than a month, allowing staff to better serve our relatives.

In realizing the importance of office appearance and first impressions to the patient, Dr. Allmer has spent his own time on evenings and weekends improving the décor of the clinic. An example includes bringing in personal artwork to hang in the reception, bathroom, and optical area. He has also patched wall defects, textured, and painted an exam room and the optical over a weekend to better match what he would expect from his previous private practice. Some evenings at home have been spent painting over yellowing plastic frame display boards to give them new life. A donation of modern display racks from our optical lab was secured and installed. Also, with the help of the optometry clinic staff, decluttering cabinets, window wells, and the rest of the office has resulted in a cleaner, more open environment. It is rare for Dr. Allmer to work only forty hours in a work week. All of this effort has been to revitalize and improve the Oyáte Eye Clinic to improve perception of quality and provide a higher level of patient satisfaction. As Dr. Allmer has frequently said, our IHS patients deserve just as good of care as a private practice patient.

One of Dr. Allmer's biggest accomplishments to date has been getting new, technologically advanced equipment to better manage their diabetic and glaucoma patients. During the transition process, Dr. Allmer began exploring available resources and requesting a list of diagnostic equipment to supplement and even replace aging equipment that had not been replaced in over fifteen years, eons in the world of technology. During his tenure, in a limited funding location the Oyáte eye clinic has managed to acquire an optical coherence tomographer with angiography, an ultra-widefield fundus camera with fundus auto-

fluorescence, corneal topography, auto-refractometry/keratometry, a new visual field unit with SITA faster, and a new exam lane. All of this has been to allow a higher level of care at the clinic to promote optometry's abilities and decrease the number of outside referrals, thus decreasing expenses and patient inconvenience as well as improving optometry's reputation and image.

Dr. Allmer has also been working on the clinic's records management system. He has instituted a process to transfer patient prescriptions from paper to electronic format, thus minimizing loss of patient records, improving HIPAA compliance, saving valuable resources, and requiring less filing time and space. He has also worked with the local IT staff to create more efficient, eye exam friendly templates to allow less time finishing chart work and more time to spend interacting with patients. These changes have improved patient flow and allowed patients to have a little more face to face time with staff.

Since the time of the 638 transition, the eye clinic has only recently approached adequate staffing levels. In full communication with hospital administration, Dr. Allmer continues to work on these and other challenges to improve the patient experience, all while continuing to see a full patient schedule. Despite the challenges of being short-staffed, Dr. Allmer and his team have worked diligently to continue providing high quality vision care. In continuing patient satisfaction surveys conducted since July of 2019, the eye clinic has received a 100% rating level of good or excellent on all surveys received.

In recognition of his tireless efforts to improve his patients' experience and provide high quality, technologically advanced eye care, I nominate Dr. Derek Allmer for the Lester Caplan Award for outstanding civil service optometrist. He has put in extraordinary efforts to establish the Oyáte eye clinic, making the clinic more modern, efficient, better equipped, and visually appealing. All these positive changes benefit the patients, Oyáte Health Center, the profession of optometry, and the Indian Health Service. As Dr. Allmer would tell you, it is all for the higher goal of taking better care of our relatives.
