Dr. Celine Gabai has excelled as a junior optometrist with her work at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center (PIMC) as an outstanding, efficient and innovative clinical Optometrist. She has exceeded expectations with her COVID response efforts during her detailed assignments.

Dr. Gabai stepped up the plate during the COVID response. She was detailed (temporarily assigned) away from her primary duties as an Optometrists 3 separate times. Twice as part of a supervisory team of the First Look screening stations and central triage. She would round with each of the station physically and ensure staff safety and maintain supply levels. When Dr. Gabai saw a need she would work diligently on how to improve the system. This was seen when the First look stations were necessary to move inside. She learned how to draft in Visio and mocked up many different alternate options for screening stations at each location. During her detailed assignments, she was extremely flexible with her working hours and stayed late many times to ensure the assignments were performed.

She performed well on peer reviews and focus peer reviews with no fallouts on all peer reviews this last year. This meticulous documentation proved beneficial for the whole hospital as she ensured that the First Look screeners all maintained 100 % training. She had the expertise to handle the most complex Optometry case and when necessary, consulted well with other providers. She was always ready to assist other providers, which allowed her to have more patient encounters than any other optometrist at PIMC.

She has been reliable to be at work at assigned times, with no days being late. She often stays after hours with patient care or finishing records. Dr. Gabai has responsibility of one outlying field clinics. She has gone above her duty by participating in health fairs at Ft. McDowell to educate the population about eye disease. She has good rapport with the patients and clinical staff. Dr. Gabai has an interest in Pediatric patients and pursued this by becoming the primary provider in the newly created pediatric Optometry clinic that was recently created.

Dr. Gabai is always professional and respectful in her communications with patients and co-workers. In a leadership role with the central triage and first look stations she communicated with all departments on a daily basis to establish the services available that day for the central triage tent. She is the model for the new team approach for Optometry.

Dr. Gabai observed that many of the PIMC Optometry patients were being lost to follow-up. The system relied on the patients calling the clinic to schedule the follow-up when the providers schedule opened. She used the EHR system to create a database where patients could be called by the optometry scheduler, when the providers' schedule opened for the month.

Because of her interest and experience with contact lenses, Dr. Gabai was put on the technical team for a blanket purchase agreement (BPA) for the medically necessary contact lens program. She has learned this year more how to fit medically necessary contact lenses Her records are always completed efficiently on the day of encounter even when it requires her staying late at work. She has never had to cancel any field clinic assignments.
