IV. Subcommittee Reports:

- LCDR Davis: New voting members for next year. Looks like we may have 3 positions next year and get that out in the next week of so beginning of June. That is one of my top priorities right now. That's all I have.
- CDR Eubanks: ____LCDR Schwab already went over the awards given away at Minneapolis. It was good to see the awardees. RE: STEM Scholoarship (same as the above).
- CDR Bertulfo: Good Afternoon (GA) everyone, the biggest thing from a communications standpoint at COF was what they introduced Operations Corps Strong ...behavioral health resources for those going out on deployment there may be a need to tap into behavioral health resources when you get back from deployment. That was introduced at COF. Feel free to peruse the site to see what resources are available post deployment or anything outside of deployment.

It's a great opportunity for anybody to be able to partake in a Navy deployment. CDR Devin Williams added to say that it we need to work to overcome the stigma of deploying and being away from family. If we want the same benefits we cannot cherry-pick. LCDR Davis' adds that we had to high-frequency and crypto things. CDR Williams, I had to give a demonstration on satellite phonesI hope that helps people applying for this. LCDR Schwab, I think there should be pretty good competition for people applying. If IT Officers can join in too that would be great.

- LCDR Chow question to LCDR Davis, Did they train you before you deployed. LCDR Davis, I received special training for the deployment. I'm pretty sure they will help you and place you where they need you.
- CDR Walker, I just spent the past 2 days with the Army on communications and they put me in for a Military Award. There was a sponsored dinner and you got to meet up with the DOD and you got to meet up with other IT people. Awardees were also invited to attend the follow-on luncheon. This award is annual and I had no idea it would be submitted by your peers. LCDR Schwab, it was nice to see you at the COF. CDR Walker, I plan on joining the DC chapter. I made a lot of connections. If you're not a member, I plan on joining. I used to be a member when I was an Army Communications Officer. I'll let you know what the process is to become a member. LCDR Davis, how much do you know about Natural

Language Processing (NLP). CDR Walker, we were using NLP and focusing on looking at legacy data and converting that text into computable data. I met a guy with Amazon Web Service and he has some contacts.and we may be able to re-energize our project.

CDR Williams, available to PHS Officers, If you haven't looked at the Naval War College, you can take these courses for free and you qualify for a Masters. I'm about to graduate. You need to take a fleet seminar. But they have something called the fleet seminar program and they have several locations (i.e. Capitol Hill, Navy Yard). It's a pretty stringent program and you have to do a lot of reading. Technically, it's a 3 year program but I got mine done in a year and 9-months. You can double-up after the first year. There is a lot of Navy-speak it is the Naval War College. If you double-up, it's 2 nights each week. My area of study was information operations because I studies information security. They have other areas of study. Very interesting program. Feel free to call me if you're interested. It's doable and it's free.
