












History of India Land of Ancient Civilization

- The earliest period of Indian history is the Indus Valley Civilization, which existed from approximately 3300 BCE to 1300 BCE
- India was ruled by several major empires, including the Maurya Empire, the Gupta Empire, the Mughal Empire, and the British Raj.
- Between the sixth and fifth centuries BC, Gautama <u>Buddha was born and founded the Buddhist</u> <u>religion.</u>
- Medieval Period, beginning of modern languages
 and caste system
- 18th century, the East India Company took control of India after setting up a trade monopoly. India was then ruled by the British Empire
- India achieved its independence in 1947
- Indians made significant advances in architecture (Taj Mahal), mathematics (the invention of zero) and medicine (Ayurveda). Today, India is a very diverse country

National bird is the peacock National animal is Bengal tiger National flower is lotus




Facts about Incredible India

- Most multilingual country of the world Over 19,500 different dialects and 121 languages are spoken
- The Eighth Schedule of the Constitution consists of the following 22 languages –Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Kashmiri, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Nepali, Oriya, Punjabi, Sanskrit, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, Bodo, Santhal, Maithili and Dogri.

Hinduism: A spiritual way of life consisting of five key elements:dharma,worship, selfless service, philosophical study, and Sadhana/meditation


ISLAM THE SECOND LARGEST RELIGION IN INDIA –RELIGION BASED ON teachings of Muhammad and centered around the Quran


















Diwali -the festival of lights

The movies are historically known for their = singing, dancing, & forbidden love. They portray themes that reflect typical household life and traditional Indian values, which resonate with much of the country.












INDIA-GLOBAL ECONOMIC INFLUENCE












Indra Nooyi and the 5 C's: Competency, Courage and Confidence, Communication, Consistency, and Compass
