

Credentialing & Privileging

Starting January 1, 2019, pharmacists applying for NCPS certification must be credentialed and privileged (C&P) through their local medical staff. Facilities not in compliance may request a waiver including:

- 1) Steps taken towards C&P of pharmacists.
- 2) Barriers encountered to C&P pharmacists.
- 3) Future plans to accomplish C&P of pharmacists.
