

CLINICAL SPOTLIGHT

"Call to Action: Embracing a New Era for Pharmacists in Substance Use Disorder and Recovery Services"

In March 2023, CAPT Ted Hall and CDR Teresa Grund presented exciting information during the IHS Advancing Pharmacists Roles in Substance Use Disorder Treatment and Recovery Teams ECHO regarding recent changes to legislation allowing DEA licensed pharmacists to prescribe buprenorphine for treatment of individuals suffering with opioid use disorder. Evidenced-based information addressing provider burnout and resiliency was also discussed during the presentation. Results from one of the studies concluded that "addiction medicine work is intrinsically rewarding for many providers and that engaging with other addiction providers to debrief challenging encounters or engage in advocacy work can be protective against burnout." It is critically important to evaluate our individual burnout risk and take action to prevent compassion fatigue leading to burnout, not just for addiction medicine work. In addition to the resiliency information discussed in the presentation, researching and implementing strategies that will be effective for each of us uniquely is highly encouraged to be able to provide the best care to our patients, our self, colleagues, and family. The SUD ECHO is a great resiliency support beyond clinical information and you are encouraged to join! Sample Patient Encounter Log

Since our transition to a more comprehensive care model, the NCPS Committee has received many questions about the Patient Encounter Log. Here is a sample patient encounter log for your reference. Each practice is different and this log should reflect the vast scope of practice that we are involved in as we innovatively lead pharmacists across the nation.

Encounter	Date	Diagnosis addressed at this encounter
1	x/x/xx	DM2, immunizations, hypothyroidism
2	x/x/xx	DM2, immunizations, CVD, tobacco cessation
3	x/x/xx	Anticoagulation, CVD, immunizations, HTN
4	x/xx/xx	DM2, HTN, immunizations
5	x/xx/xx	DM2, immunizations, CAD, CKD
6	x/xx/xx	Tobacco cessation, DM2, asthma, immunizations

Note: All patient encounters must be within 12 months of applicant submission date. Each encounter must include at least two diagnoses, or one diagnosis and one preventative health intervention.

NCPSC members rotate every 3 years. If you are interested in serving on the NCPSC you should contact your area pharmacy consultant or your NCPSC representative for more information.
