CAPT Gregory Dill received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business and Economics from Lafayette College in 1991. He later obtained an Associate of Science in Engineering Science from Harold Washington College in 1995. CAPT Dill went on to obtain a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Illinois in 1999 and a Masters of Public Health from California College of Health Sciences in 2011.

CAPT Dill has a broad range of professional certifications and training in the areas of executive management and leadership, lipid management, pharmacy-based immunization delivery, and emergency preparedness.

**CURRENT JOB DESCRIPTION:**

CAPT Dill serves as the Acting Consortium Administrator of the Consortium for Financial Management and Fee for Service Operations (CFMFFSO) at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). He leads the administration of the Medicare fee-for-service program at the regional level to protect over 57 million beneficiaries, inform over 1.6 million health care providers, and ensure the Medicare program's fiscal integrity. CAPT Dill is also the San Francisco Regional Administrator and Deputy Consortium Administrator for CFMFFSO where he is responsible for representing CMS in California, Arizona, Nevada, Hawaii and the Pacific Territories.

CAPT Dill provides senior executive leadership to staff located in Regional Offices and is responsible for planning and implementing all Agency outreach initiatives and campaign management activities within the geographic areas for which he is affiliated. He is a regional champion for CMS' regional external affairs program, including serving as a liaison for national organizations, other Federal agencies, State and local governments, advocacy groups, beneficiaries, and the media.

**QUALIFYING SKILLS FOR CURRENT POSITION:**

Prior to CAPT Dill's current position, he served as the Associate Regional Administrator for the Chicago Division of CFMFFSO where he provided regional and consortium supervision and leadership on the local administration of the Medicare fee-for-service program through the execution of Medicare Parts A and B operations primarily involving delivery of provider outreach, beneficiary customer service, and contractor oversight. He also served as a pharmacist in CMS' Division of Drug Plan Policy and Analysis, in the Chicago Regional Office. During CAPT Dill's experience at CMS, he has gained extensive knowledge of CMS staff and operations as well as second-level and senior executive level management and leadership experience.

CAPT Dill has had a broad range of professional experiences throughout his public health career including prior experience in pharmaceutical industry, pharmacy practice, and at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. He has been recognized for his remarkable work through numerous Agency and USPHS awards.
