Call to Order and Welcome: CDR Deborah Dee

CPO Report: CAPT John Eckert

- o Recognized and thanked outgoing Voting & EB members for their service to the PAC
- Recognized and welcomed the incoming Voting & EB members noted his eagerness to work alongside all officers in the PAC (voting and non-voting members) for the remainder of his term as CPO, which ends November 2021
- Per RADM Orsega, the next Chief Scientist Officer will likely be selected and announced in mid-October
- CPO selections being made for 5 PHS Categories; with competing priorities in the Immediate OSG, CPO selection is expected to take an extended period of time – selection and appointment made by the SG and interviews (multiple rounds) are ongoing
- Reminder: CCHQ sent an email August 31, 2021, regarding the importance of maintaining PHS readiness requirements – not just because it is policy and failure to comply can have career impact, but because we are a deployable force in the midst of multiple public health emergencies; we have an obligation to fellow Officers and the nation to be prepared to respond when need arises
- Reminded Officers of the COVID-19 vaccination mandate for PHS Officers; deadline for completing the series is September 30, 2021; if Officers have not yet started a vaccination series, the Jansen (J&J) vaccine is the only option remaining to avoid being deemed "not qualified" in October; no information is available from CCHQ regarding waivers; please contact MAB if seeking information about a waiver; unclear what, if any, will be granted
- o For the Scientist Category, threats about adverse personnel action due to failure to maintain deployment readiness are not necessary; our category has an overall readiness of 96%, with 9 of the 18 Officers not meeting readiness standards being O-6; the most common deficiency among "not qualified" officers is missing PHU; in most cases this is because of conflicts between scheduled exams and deployment
- o Announced that our Category is comprised of 409 Officers as September 14, with 4 new Officers in the current OBC (September class) − 3 CDC and 1 USCG (psychologist); we continue to grow as a Category, even in this era of contraction across PHS. This is seen through continuing CADs, retention of Officers with fewer than 15 years of service (other categories are experiencing an increase in losses/separations of Officers in this group)

- and fewer retirements (we had 1 Officer retire in September)
- Invited Officers who still require counseling following this year's promotion board review to contact him to schedule a session; it is taking quite a bit of time due to the large number of Officers requiring counseling; may request additional counseling assistance from O-6 officers; urged patience as he works through the process
- Encouraged Officers to use annual leave if possible; no word from CCHQ or OSG regarding legislative relief to allow Officers to carry over >60 days of leave this year

Chair Report: CDR Deborah Dee

- o Welcome to new SciPAC Voting Members and SC Chairs/Co-Chairs!
- o Sincere thanks to our outgoing EB members and SC Chairs for your commitment to Officers and our Category, and your many contributions.
- Special thanks to our Immediate Past Chair, CDR Wilken, for his dedication to our category and PHS, and for his work to improve awareness of the many accomplishments, skills, and contributions of Scientist Officers to public health and to meeting the missions of their agencies and PHS.
- o A priority of my term will be supporting Officers' mental health and well-being.
 - o Pandemic is ongoing, as are agency and CCHQ/RDB deployments.
 - o Unpredictability, separations, disruptions to routines can exacerbate stress.
- o Pandemic response is a marathon, not a sprint. Thus, I encourage us to work toward finding some balance across our OPDIV work, SciPAC commitments, and deployment responsibilities—prioritizing the health and well-being of yourselves and loved ones.
 - o Model self-care: take your leave if you can; practice healthy habits; if you are a supervisor, encourage your staff to do likewise

- o It's a challenging time for Scientists—and for PHS Officers in general—as we carry a heavy burden of both deployment and duty station work while also keeping up with modernization initiatives. I'm interested in hearing about your challenges and your ideas for working within the system to better support our Officers.

In addition, the draft document includes examples of how officers can demonstrate fulfillment of the precepts. The WG's developed guidance has been submitted for leadership review.
- o The Continuing Education (CE) Contact Hour Initiative Team identifies CE opportunities to support SciPAC officers in meeting the annual CE requirement. The updated CE list for August will be distributed this week. *The team is requesting that Officers share their ideas for training opportunities.*

Category Day: Chair: <u>LCDR Rebecca Levine</u>

- Scientist Virtual Category Day was held on Friday, August 20, 2021, from 11am–5pm ET, followed by a virtual social at 5:30pm ET.
- 156 Officers participated in the Virtual Category Day event (from 5 different countries);
 40 Officers participated in the Virtual Social Event.
- Thank you to everyone for their efforts in making the day a success, especially to the members of the Category Day SC. We also thank members of the Awards, Mentoring, and Psychologist Integration SCs who supported the event and presenters and participants for their time and interest.
- The Category Day subcommittee held a "hot wash" meeting on August 26, 2021, where we discussed lessons learned; they will be incorporated into future events.
- o Because a SciPAC Survey Monkey account is not currently available, the Category Day Evaluation Team is exploring options for how to distribute an evaluation.
- o LOAs for 2021 SC members and Category Day presenters are being drafted.

- o SC leadership is drafting the 2021 Category Day SC Annual Report.
- The Category Day SOP is being revised after 1 round of feedback from the SciPAC EB.
 It will incorporate updates from the virtual program.
- o SC leadership is already beginning preparations for Category Day 2022.
 - The SC is actively looking for volunteers to help plan Category Day 2022. If you are interested, please reach out to <u>LCDR Rebecca Levine</u>.

Deployment Preparedness: CDR John Pesce

- O **Readiness Reporting:** As of September, 391 (95.6%) of the 409 Regular Corps Scientist Officers are either basic ready (n= 376) or exempt (n=15). Eighteen (3.4%) are not qualified. There are *not qualified* officers in all ranks (O3–O6). Unless you are planning on retiring soon, you are putting your career at risk by not being basic ready. If you are having trouble with readiness, please reach out to the Deployment Preparedness SC and we will help as we are able.
- o The <u>Deployment Preparedness SC</u> website has been updated.
- The Response Preparedness Team will be implementing a Lunch & Learn Brown Bag Series on ESF8 and NDMS roles and functions during deployment. The presentation schedule will be advertised soon.
- The SC SOP has been revised and the Annual Report has been submitted to the EB for review.
- o LOAs for members of the Deployment Preparedness SC this past year are being
- o developed and will be submitted to SciPAC leadership by the end of this week.
- Deployment Preparedness leadership will be meeting shortly to discuss the plan for the year and determine what our staffing profile will look like. We have already identified a need for our new Psychologists officers and would like to invite any of those officers who are interested in being part of our team to contact CDR Pesce or LCDR Muniz-Ortiz.
- Make sure you are up to date on vaccinations. Flu season is approaching, and we are all required to be vaccinated for influenza. Additionally, there are new COVID-19 vaccination requirements (must complete series and upload documentation by September 30, 2021).
- Please be aware of the new training requirements (online courses) that were announced by CCHQ on August 31, 2021. They must be completed by January 2, 2022. All training can be found in the <u>CCLMS</u> and are focused on the following areas: cultural awareness, harassment, resiliency, and ethics.
 - Training certificates are not required to be added to your eOPF separately.

- **O Mentor Recruitment Team:**
 - The summer is always a busy time for onboarding new CADs to the Scientist Category. We are thrilled to welcome these new Scientists, but—at present—we do *not* have enough mentors in the Peer Support Network (PSN) to ensure they

each have an optimal onboarding experience. If you are an O-3 Officer with 2+ years in PHS, please volunteer your time to this important effort! You will be matched with 1 new CAD for a 1-year commitment. Email <u>LCDR Matt Steele</u> and <u>LCDR Folasade Kembi</u> to express interest.

Mentor Matching Team

- As we transition to a new OY, we continue to accept <u>applications</u> for those who need a mentor or would like to be a mentor. Completed applications can be sent to <u>LCDR Michelle Hughes</u> & <u>LCDR Leora Feldstein</u>.
- The Matching Team—in conjunction with other teams—increased mentor/mentee matches by 7% (from 116 to 124 matches) during the 2021–2022 operational year; additionally, process changes led to a 33% increase in mentor/mentee match renewals. In all, over 180 Scientist Officers engaged with the formal mentoring program during the operational year.
- o LOAs for mentors are currently being generated and distributed.

Output Mentor Capacity-Building Team

- In conjunction with the Category Day SC, the team successfully completed a Category Day Networking & Mentoring Activity on August 20, 2021, with more than 60 participants.
- O There was a well-received Mentoring panel discussion during the August 3rd SciPAC meeting—providing more than 170 Scientists with advice on mentoring and career development. The topic of discussion was *Tips for Maintaining a Successful Mentor/Mentee Relationship*.
- o The team has finalized edits to the Mentoring Guidebook and will disseminate the revised Guidebook via the website and listsery in the new OY.

If presentations are agency-related, they must be approved (with email documentation) by the author's Agency Team Lead. PHS review of abstracts can occur in parallel with local review, but the PHS Review Team must receive abstracts no later than October 1, 2021. Abstracts are due to AMSUS by October 4, 2021; no extensions will be granted. Follow AMSUS submission guidelines for abstract development and submit abstracts to LCDR Matthew Gunter, Chair for the Abstracts Review Subcommittee for the PHS review process.

- CCHQ posted a minor change to the uniform policy CCI413.01 "Special Uniform Situations." This change allows for the wear of compression leggings, shorts, and shirts under the PT uniform.
- The 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) has passed the House and is pending in the Senate. The 2021 NDAA proposes the following notable changes, which may affect PHS Officers:
 - o It would amend the Fair Credit Reporting Act to give PHS officers the right to place an active duty alert on their credit file.
 - o It makes changes to Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) eligibility, allowing PHS officers to receive instruction at the university 'within the scope of their employment.'
 - Extends the authority for the Secretary of Defense to make temporary increases to the Basic Allowance for Housing for certain areas until December 31, 2022.
 This does not guarantee that such an increase will be implemented.
 - Amends the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) to require that uniformed service members and their spouses be allowed to transfer their professional licenses between states if they are ordered to relocate.
 - The above changes HAVE NOT become law. The Policy SC will make further announcements if the bill becomes law with the above changes. Additionally, these changes may require further policy revisions from other agencies, departments and/or CCHQ to be placed into effect.

Special Presentation: Dr. Barry Simon, CCHQ Medical Affairs Branch

 Dr. Simon presented "Medical Affairs Branch Updates and Discussion of Impact of Receiving Mental Health Care," in which he addressed some common myths about PHS officers seeking mental health care, taking mental health-related medications, and answered questions submitted by officers

- Some highlights from the presentation included:
 - Encouragement by Dr. Simon for all PHS officers to seek whatever kind of care they need, whether mental health care or care for any physical health issue – don't delay seeking care of any sort
 - Or. Simon discussed fitness for duty evaluations and the associated criteria, which relate to an officer's ability to do their duty after a reasonable amount of treatment time, and reiterated that MAB is not concerned when an officer is able to obtain care and can function in their duty; MAB typically becomes involved only if a mental health condition is associated with breaks in reality or concerns about the officer's judgment, reliability, or trustworthiness
 - Differentiation between current accession and retention standards related to mental health
 - Materials (slides/recording) will be posted upon receipt of CCHQ approval to do so
- Dr. Simon also provided reminders about the deployment waiver request submission process; 2022 PHU and common reasons for PHU rejection; DD 2807-1 (medical history form); Verified Weight Form PHS-7044-1; and more

Mentor Matching Team

o Currently 132 active mentor-mentee agreements on file, and there are 9 unmatched mentee applicants (7 from CDC, 1 from FDA, 1 from DoD).

- o 53% of Scientist Officers are engaged as either a mentor or mentee.
- Presented an overview of the mentor matching and renewal processes to all SC members (on other teams) and led discussion on how to coordinate internally to offset the burden of communications with mentors and mentees.
- o Provided target populations for recruitment based on current needs.

Mentor Capacity-Building Team (MCBT)

- o The SciPAC mentoring orientation was held on January 19, 2022, 1–2pm EST, led by CDR Neal Kimble and LCDR Christine Brady with 68 participants. Once the recording is available, the team will add the presentation to Max.gov and send the link and PowerPoint out through the listsery.
- MCBT will host a second Mentoring Panel Discussion during the July SciPAC Monthly Meeting. The Team is identifying Senior Scientist Officers to serve as panelists.
- o MCBT is coordinating with the Category Day team to determine how we can best support the planned Category Day activities.

o Policy SC: CDR Adam Bjork; Co-chair: LCDR Matthew Steele

- o On December 22, CCHQ provided information on submission of annual height, weight, and BMI measurements by either PHU or the Verified Weight Form (PHS-7044-1):
 - As of January 1, 2022, only the PHU or PHS-7044-1 will be considered official weight reporting since they are completed by an approved healthcare professional (the officer's medical provider, registered dietitian, or exercise physiologist who is trained and/or qualified to complete "taping").
 - Officers will continue to include weight data with the APFT, but it will no longer determine compliance with Retention Weight Standards (RWS). Additionally, weight waivers, pregnancy waivers, and APFT waivers do not preclude officers from submitting weight annually.
- Excess leave (email dated January 24, 2022). CCHQ itemized the steps they took to handle excess leave:
 - Leave approved by the supervisor and not confirmed by the officer was deducted from the officer's leave balance
 - Leave requested by the officer but not approved by the supervisor and pending in the system was automatically canceled
 - o FY2021 excess leave has been combined with the FY 2020 excess leave balance.
 - Excess leave can only be used in increments of 1.0 days. If an officer's excess leave balance is in an increment of 0.5 days, then 0.5 days of leave will be taken from the officer's annual leave and added to excess leave to make it 1.0 days, and therefore useable. Officers must use their excess leave by September 30, 2023.
- National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022
 - Signed by the President and became law on December 27, 2021.
 - Please note the following items below may require further rulemaking by one or more agencies and policy issuance by PHS HQ before they are implemented.
 - Solidified authorization for PHS officers to attend the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) (Sec. 718, page 250). Authorized provision of instruction at USUHS to certain Federal employees.

- Pilot program on direct hire authority for spouses of members of the uniformed services at locations outside the United States (Sec. 625, pages 232–234).
 - The Secretary of Defense may carry out a pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of using the authority under subsection (b) to hire spouses of members of the uniformed services at locations outside the United States.
 - If you feel you may be affected by this pilot program, the Policy SC recommends you consult with your liaison or CCHQ.
- Conducting a study to look into electronic voting for service members in remote locations, including services for registering to vote, requesting an electronic ballot, completing the ballot, and returning the ballot (Sec. 1077, page 378).
- Future DoD construction projects requirement for Nursing/Lactation spaces (by building type)
- The "Veterans in Parks" Program still does not include uniformed services clarified "Armed Forces and their dependents" designation (Sec. 641, page 236).
- Improvements to Postpartum Care Study/Action at military medical treatment facilities (Please note that certain provisions of this section apply only to the armed forces) (Sec. 707, page 242).
- Revisions to TRICARE provider networks (Sec. 703, pages 239–240).
 - The revisions noted indicate a system of multiple networks of providers under TRICARE Select and TRICARE Prime in the same geographic area(s).
 - These changes may impact certain officers in remote locations, especially those enrolled in TRICARE select. The Policy SC recommends impacted officers contact TRICARE directly.
- As per notifications sent to Agency Liaisons:
 - Effective January 1, 2022, the time limitation for household goods (HHG) in connection with an officer's retirement has been changed in the Joint Travel Regulations paragraph 052013. The time length for movement of HHG has increased from 1 year to 3 years from active-duty termination date. After the 3-year period, requests for extensions may be approved on an annual basis not to exceed a maximum of 6 years. This change does not affect non-temporary storage.
 - Any officer who tests positive for COVID-19, MUST upload test results to the medical file within the eDOC-U system (no need to email MAB the same information).
 - Documentation MUST include the officer's name, SERNO, and date of test. PCR test results likely contain some of this information, but at-home tests likely do not and the info should be added before converting the document to a PDF and uploading to the medical file.
 - If an officer is unable to obtain a COVID-19 test, the officer should submit a written statement including why they think they have COVID-19. The statement should include the officer's name, SERNO, dates, etc. and be uploaded to the medical file.

- Now that all psychologists are Scientist officers, PsychPAG, a psychology-based professional group housed under HSPAC, has been discontinued.
- With PsychPAG no longer in existence, we have been working with CAPT Sandhu and CDR Dee on the best course of action moving forward to continue the duties traditionally managed by PsychPAG (e.g., board certification resources and mentoring, resources for behavioral health deployments, and concerns related specifically to psychologists).

At the onset of the meeting, he announced that the DoD has approved the distribution of at-home test kits to be dispensed through military treatment facilities (MTFs) and military outpatient clinics. Up to 8 kits per ID card holder can be dispensed monthly. While this is good news for those who reside near a MTF, it is not favorable for those who don't. For those individuals, a prescription will still be needed to be reimbursed for at-home test kits. MG Appenzeller reinforced that there is no change in TRICARE benefits, and local procedures to distribute the free kits may vary from location to location. Free kits can also be requested at www.covidtest.gov, and you can also check with your local health department, libraries, and other community sites to see if free kits are available in your area. Call to Order and Welcome: CDR Deborah Dee

CPO Report: <u>CAPT Sukhminder K. Sandhu</u>

- Promotion results were released yesterday (June 6) by CCHQ—much earlier than in previous years. - CAPT Sandhu congratulated this year's JOAG Award recipients: **LCDR Xinzhi Zhang** is the recipient of the JOAG Junior Officer of the Year Award and **LCDR Rebecca Levine** is the recipient of the JOAG VADM C. Everett Koop Junior Officer Award.

Chair Report: CDR Deborah Dee

- Thank you to the SciPAC Category Day Subcommittee!
 - Category Day was outstanding—from the speaker line-up to the evening social, we could all see the hard work that went into the event, and we were very happy to have the opportunity—the first in several years—to be with one another. We appreciate your dedication and all the effort and thought you put into making the

- day such a tremendous success. Kudos for making our "reunion" Category Day so fantastic!
- Speakers: wow thank you for sharing your work, guidance, experiences with us through your presentations, all of which were so very well done, interesting, and informative.
- o Attendees: it was great to reconnect with each other and so nice to see you all!
- Temporary promotion results were released June 6
 - Congratulations to those who were promoted! We are all happy for you and hope you will be able to find some time to celebrate your achievements and this career milestone.
 - Unfortunately, promotion rates were low, and many very deserving officers were not promoted. For those not promoted during this cycle, first of all, you already know that your rank does not define you nor does it represent the full impact and value of your work.
 - Missing promotion can generate a lot of emotions and can feel demoralizing, discouraging, depressing, or at least that's how I felt last year. I won't try to talk you out of whatever feelings you have they are yours. I will share that it took me "a minute" (sarcasm there it much longer than a minute) to process my feelings. Take the time you need to process yours, whatever they may be.
 - I was speaking with members of our SciPAC Mental Health and Well-Being Initiative about what "processing feelings" might entail and want to share some of what came of those discussions in case it helps even one person:
 - Whatever you're feeling, be patient with yourself; give yourself some time to focus on those feelings. As one person shared with me, "It's important to feel those feelings deeply." Try to prioritize yourself and give yourself time to do that. We're often quick to make time for others, while not doing the same for ourselves. Reconsider that, perhaps you deserve some dedicated time.
 - Consider various ways to engage with whatever you're feeling —maybe some stress-relieving exercise or meditation, listening to music you like, talking with a good friend who really listens.
 - It's also okay to take some time to focus on something else entirely and not think about work or promotions. Grab a friend and go to a Braves (or Nationals or Reds or Rockies, etc.) game. Find the recipe for that elaborate dessert you wanted to make and give yourself an afternoon to make it. Spend time outside taking a long walk around your neighborhood, a hike in the mountains, or a bike ride somewhere you've always wanted to go. Whatever brings you happiness let yourself do that and enjoy it.
 - All of this is not meant to suggest it is at all easy to accept a missed promotion not at all. It can feel terrible not to be selected. We know how hard Scientists work and how dedicated Scientists are. If you were not promoted this cycle, I hope you will make time for yourself if you can. After you've done that and perhaps practiced some well-deserved self-care, when you're ready to begin thinking about your next packet or if you want feedback on steps you might be able to take, know that we will be here, ready to talk with, support, and assist you. Perhaps you want to

pursue mentorship or reach out to identify a new mentor; maybe you want to think about a leadership role on a subcommittee during the upcoming SciPAC operational year or in your program. Whatever it is, if you want to talk it through or seek advice and guidance, please reach out to your SciPAC colleagues, whether to pursue formal promotion or career counseling, or something else entirely...we are here to help.

 Officers should sign into their CCMIS Officer Secure Area and note their next on-call month.
- The Deployment Preparedness SC is developing a new program, the SciPAC Deployment Buddy Program, to provide deployment mentorship to Scientist Officers who possess little or no deployment experience. By developing a relationship with a seasoned Scientist deployer, the Officer will gain insight into preparing themselves, their family, and their household prior to a deployment. We are partnering with the Mentoring SC prior to the launch of the program. Scientist Officers interested in helping to shape and launch this initiative should reach out to LCDR Jason Caballero.

O Mentor Recruitment Team:

- Representatives from the Peer Support Network and Mentor Matching Team met with the Readiness and Deployment SC to discuss lessons learned and best practices related to recruitment and matching of Officer skillsets to inform a proposed Deployment Mentoring program in the planning phase.

Mentor Matching Team

- Currently, there are 158 active mentor-mentee agreements on file, and there are 9 unmatched mentee applicants (7 from CDC, 2 from FDA). There is a need for 2 O-4 mentors in CDER (or another Center in FDA).
 - o 5 new mentor-mentee match agreements were made in May
 - o 60% of Scientist Officers are engaged as either a mentor or mentee.

o Mentor Capacity-Building Team

O Please join the SciPAC Mentoring Subcommittee for a panel discussion titled, "Exploring New Insights into Mentoring Relationships" immediately following the SciPAC meeting updates on July 5. The panel will be moderated by CDR Chekesha Clingman and LT Dantrell Simmons on topics such as promotion, career advancement, and deployment.

- o Policy SC: CDR Adam Bjork; Co-chair: LCDR Matthew Steele
 - o CCHQ announced that we will be ending the 24/7 alert status for deployments and transitioning to a new 1-tiered deployment strategy comprised of 5 Deployment Teams for all PHS officers. These 5 Deployment Teams will replace all previous teams as well as the temporary 5-month preference survey approach. All PHS officers will be assigned to 1 of the 5 on-call Deployment Teams and be on-call every fifth month. This new structure takes effect June 1, 2022. All officers should check their Officer Secure Area dashboard to see their new on-call month.
 - o CCHQ Released <u>POM 821.86</u> "Flag Board and Processes." The POM establishes processes and procedures for flag boards. This POM s mostly applicable to officers at the O-6, O-7, and O-8 grades.
 - CCHQ has held a series of CCHQ-Connect discussions on the many new policy changes that have recently been announced. These sessions were recorded and can be found in the secure area of CCMIS. Summaries of each session have been prepared by the Policy Subcommittee:
 - CCHQ Session 1 "Promotion Category and Rank Conversion": Beginning in Promotion Year (PY) 2024 there will be 5 categories for promotion purposes only, each led by 1 of the statutory admirals. Scientists will be split between the Allied Health category (psychologists) and the Applied Public Health category (all other Scientists). This change will not eliminate the current professional categories.
 - CCHQ Session 2 "Readiness and Practice Hours": Clinical practice hours must be maintained by all officers in clinical deployment roles* and all officers applying for or receiving health professional special pay, incentive pay, or retention bonus. Updates to CCI 241.01, "Readiness and Duty Requirements", define the criteria for primary deployment role and clinical practice hours (based on qualifying degree; minimum of 80 annual clinical practice hours), deployment preparation plan (will be required annually beginning in October), and retention weight standards (PHU is the official annual weight to determine weight compliance). *Officers who commissioned in the following disciplines are considered to be in clinical deployment roles: medical, dental, nurse, licensed psychologist, pharmacy, veterinary, dietitian, therapist, dental hygienist, optometry, physician assistant, podiatry, medical technology, and licensed clinical social worker.
 - CCHQ Session 3 "Failure to Promote, Restricted vs Non-restricted, & Opt-out": CCHQ discussed the consequences of failure to be promoted depending on whether an officer is in a restricted or unrestricted category. Currently, all Scientists are in a restricted category. For restricted categories, promotions to the O-4, O-5, and O-6 grades will only be made if vacancies exist, based on force distribution. Under current policy, for restricted categories, failure to be promoted to one of these grades has adverse consequences if the failure was due to a "Not Recommend" recommendation from the board, placing in the bottom decile, and/or being removed from the promotion list "for cause." CCHQ is considering allowing officers to 'opt out' of promotion but no decisions have been announced.
 - CCHQ Session 4 "Force Distribution and Promotion Rates": CCHQ receives the
 official distribution structure (i.e., number of officers allowed at each grade) from
 the HHS Secretary and adjusts the rank distribution curve and promotion rates to
 ensure compliance. CCHQ discussed this adjustment process in broad terms.
 CCHQ noted that (1) promotions to higher ranks will be temporarily scaled back

- to bring the force distribution curve closer to the approved structure, and (2) successful attempts to increase recruitment at lower ranks would increase total force size and therefore increase future promotion rates at higher ranks.
- CCHQ Session 5 "New Promotion Score Sheet; Rank Order/The Line Number": CCHQ demonstrated the new promotion scoresheet. The sheet will now include the average precept score per grade and category to allow officers to compare their scores to their peers. Comments will appear only if 3 board members select a particular comment. Comments will be broken out by precept and will also demonstrate the number of board members who select the particular comment. The scores are calculated as per current policy with all recommended officers being rank-ordered and those who score 'above the line' selected for promotion. The line is determined as per the force distribution policies.
- CCHQ Session 6 "Retirement": New retirement policy adds inclusion of retirement for Ready Reserve Corps, allows retirements without a retirement board review, and clarifies when retirements can be restricted. CCHQ indicated that a future CCI will consolidate the three existing retirement policies ("Voluntary Retirement", "Retirement (30 Years)", "Involuntary Retirement (20 Years)" into one policy. New tiered retirement criteria mandate retirement at 20 years for O-1, O-2, O-3, and O-4, retirement at 26 years for O-5, and 30 years for O-6, with possibility of multi-year extensions for O-4, O-5, and O-6.

 - Information on CCWIAB: The mission of the Commissioned Corps Women's Issues Advisory Board (CCWIAB; https://dcp.psc.gov/OSG/ccwiab/) is to identify and analyze key issues that impact women in the PHS Commissioned Corps and to develop action plans to address these issues. Voting members are appointed by the Surgeon General and represent all categories within the Corps. Voting membership appointment to the CCWIAB is a 3-year commitment and work is equivalent to leadership positions in other advisory groups like JOAG, PACs, MOLC etc.
