 - The Keynote Speaker team prepared a ranked list of three potential speakers from Tulsa, OK. The speakers were approved by the Executive Board in the same rank order that they were submitted, and an invitation has been extended to the first-choice potential speaker.

 - o Readiness Reporting: As of November 1st, we have 406 Regular Corps Scientist officers and 6 Ready Reserve officers. 4 Regular Corps officers are not qualified, while 17 Regular Corps, and 4 Ready Reserve officers are exempt. Which brings us to a total of 99% Regular Corps scientist officers that are basic ready. If you are having trouble with being basic ready, please reach out to the Deployment Preparedness SC and we will do what we can to help you with your issues.  - Other Pertinent Deployment intel: We know of officers being deployed to Q stations at various international airports in relation to travelers coming from Uganda being screened for Ebola.
 - We would like to remind officers of the CPO Fitness Challenge and the REP! Which are both PHS-wide fitness programs.
 - O An Update on the Deployment Preparation Plan: HQ has delayed the releasing of the DPP template and they are working on further communications to be released to the Corps.
 - The PACs have been given the opportunity to provide feedback to CCHQ, through our CPOs, on how CCHQ might improve PHS deployment operations. Our Subcommittee has prepared a survey to capture your constructive feedback, including proposed solutions that can lead to tangible change and improvement in deployment operations. o Policy Watch:

- As a part of the "Continuing Appropriations and Ukraine Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2023," signed by the President on September 30, 2022, officers can now carryover their leave more than 60 days for FY 2022. The excess leave must be used by September 30, 2023. Those with unverified leave should have been notified. Officers must confirm all leave was taken within the eCORPS system before November 1, 2022. Leave that has not been verified will be automatically deducted from your leave balance.
- Officers may now electronically submit transcripts obtained during postgraduate training. This is applicable to training in which a Graduate Certificate, Master's, or Doctoral degree is conferred. For an officer's transcript to be considered official and to allow for its proper documentation at Commissioned Corps Headquarters (CCHQ), it must be received directly from the academic institution either electronically or in hardcopy. For electronic submissions, secured postgraduate transcripts should be submitted directly from the academic institution (or verified electronic delivery provider) to the PHS Licensure Resource Box at PHSLicensure@hhs.gov.
- O The release of the Deployment Preparation Plan (DPP) has been delayed. CCHQ will notify officers of the new release date and will update the timeline. Officers will have a minimum of three months after the release of the DPP before it becomes a readiness requirement.
- O Pursuant to section 625 of the National Defense Authorization Act of Fiscal Year 2022, a pilot program was established to assess the feasibility and advisability of using a direct hire authority to appoint spouses of members of the Uniformed Services. Members of the Uniformed Services must be stationed at locations outside of the United States in order for their spouses to be eligible for time-

- limited appointments to a competitive service position within the DoD under this authority. Appointments shall be made without regard to chapter 33, subchapter I of title 5, United States Code (U.S.C.), other than sections 3303 and 3328. As a matter of policy, section 3326 of chapter 33, subchapter I of title 5, U.S.C., and corresponding Code of Federal Regulations provisions will continue to apply.
- As a reminder, the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) reported that approximately 15,000 community pharmacies will leave the TRICARE retail pharmacy network as of October 24, 2022. Impacted beneficiaries will receive a letter from Express Scripts with a list of alternative in-network pharmacies. After October 24, 2022, beneficiaries who continue to fill prescriptions at departing community pharmacies will pay the full retail price for the medication. Walgreens and CVS remain in-network, as do many grocery store pharmacies and smaller chains. Network pharmacies also can be found using this online search tool.
