It builds on the foundations established in the Officer Basic Course and hones the skills necessary to serve as mid-level officers and the future leaders of the United States Public Health Service.
 - This course is an official temporary duty assignment (TDY). ALL officers registered for this course have been placed on official TDY orders and must follow all travel and attendance directives (<http://dcp.psc.gov/eccis/documents/PAM51.pdf>). This is Uniformed Service training, not a conference-style event. There will be long days and some evening activities/work to be accomplished.
 - Expectations
 - Own, Bring, & be able to Wear Service Dress Blues, Summer Whites, ODUs and Khaki uniforms to include all "REQUIRED" components to this training. You must pass uniform inspection in each of these uniforms.
 - Be Basic Ready
 - Have No Adverse Actions
 - Complete all academic requirements prior to attending this course.
 - Have a Satisfactory on last 2 COERs
 - Bring Physical Fitness attire. You must complete APFT (at Level 1 or higher) during this training. No treadmill or swimming option available.
 - Meet uniform & grooming standards for daily uniform inspections and throughout the course.
 - Be on time and fully participate in all class and homework activities during long hours.
 - Practice proper academic integrity.
 - No agency work while TDY during this course.
 - This is an in-residence course (No going home at night & on-site NLT 2200hrs).
 - No visitors allowed at the training facility at any time.
 - No use of electronics in class unless authorized by instructors. This includes cell phones, computers, iPads, etc.
 - Utilize proper use of Chain of Command.
 - No fraternization.
 - No behavior that would bring discredit to the uniform/service.
