He is directly involved with administrative operations of other Health Services Division areas that include Medical Director's Office, Health Programs Branch, Quality Management Branch, Office of Infectious Diseases, Office of Continuing Education, Office of Medical Designations, and Offices of Agency Chief Professional Officers (Pharmacy, Dental, Nursing, Therapist, Medical Technologist, etc.). Additionally, he provides correctional health care expertise to other local, state, federal, and international correctional jurisdictions. He recently represented the Departments of State and Justice as a speaker at the Moroccan International Correctional Health Conference, Rabat, Morocco.

### **QUALIFYING SKILLS FOR CURRENT POSITION:**

RADM Bina has served on numerous workgroups within multiple federal agencies and departments. He has deployed to address urgent public health needs, both domestic and international. He has served as a consultant for various agencies, departments and working groups.

While in pharmacy school, RADM Bina was inspired to join the USPHS through the Junior and Senior Commissioned Officer Student Training and Extern Programs (COSTEPs).
